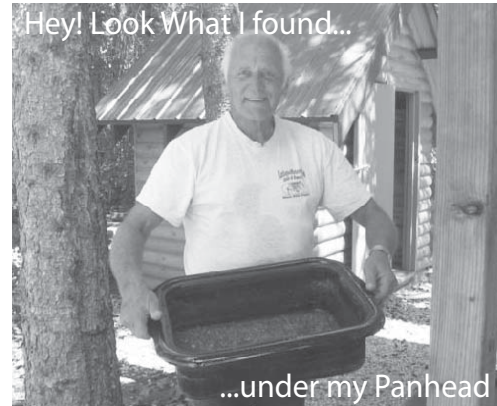

There two opportunities to ride with fellow Viking Chapter members to the Chief Blackhawk National Meet this year (see schedule of events on back page for specific dates and departure times). Ride 1 departs from Davenport, IA. Saturday morning and takes two days to get back to Minneapolis. This ride will make numerous stops on the return trip, so an additional overnight stay is planned.

- A stop for snacks at Poopys Bar/Restaurant/Bike Shop/Tattoo Parlor just South of Savanna, IL.
- A visit to The Iron Horse Social Club in Downtown Savanna, IL. and their amazing display of old racing motorcycles and memorabilia.
- A ride back across the River to Sabula, IA for an evening of entertainment and ??? at the Iron Horse Bike and Music Festival (entrance fees required).

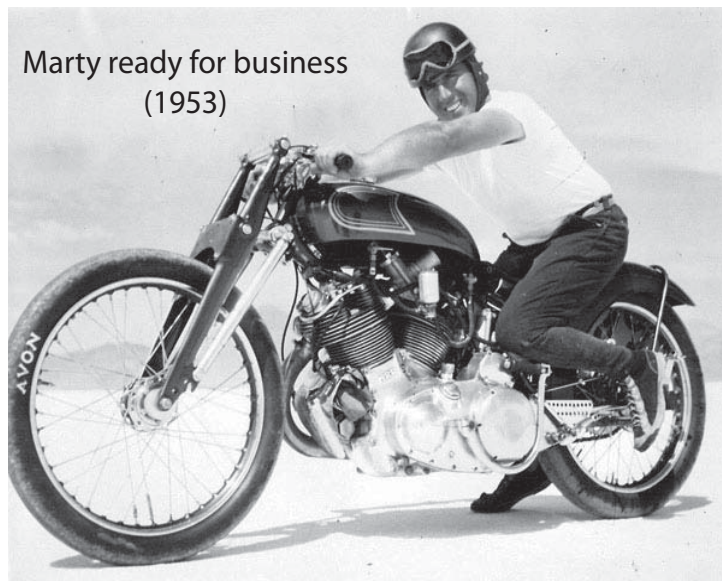

Meet Marty Dickerson and See the Competition Bikes Display

Any motorhead that lived through the '50s and '60s will tell you that the Vincent was perhaps the most famous racing bike of the 20th century and epitomized the ideal of raw power and beauty. Straight off the showroom floor, it could beat any other factory bike. But tweaked by the speed junkies of the day, it crushed speed records and held them for decades.

We are hosting a special guest at our National Meet this year with a visit from one of the most famous Vincent racers of the '50s – Marty Dickerson. The legendary competitor piled up records racing his 1948 Vincent Rapide the Bonneville Salt Flats and held the world Class C speed record unbroken for 20 years. Marty shared the salt with his friends Rollie Free and Burt Munro and served as Technical Advisor for the movie, World's Fastest Indian. His contribution as the only living racer from that time gave the movie the authentic feel that you can only get from someone that has truly been there. Recently, Marty's Minnesota connections have returned him to the Salt Flats to race at the age of 81. This time, he was aboard the record setting Vincent of Viking club member, Steve Hamel. In 2007, Marty ran a two-way average of 151.685 with an astonishing 154.456 on the return run. At 81 years old! Make sure you make it down to the meet to hear Marty speak as this could be your last chance to hear what it was like from one of the few remaining racers of that historic era. Marty will be speaking on Friday at 2:00 and 4:00, Saturday at 11:00 and 2:00. Other times may be added and we'll have other great speakers lined up, so check the web site for updates and the speaking schedule when you drop off your bike on Thursday.

In addition...

The rich history of racing in the Midwest will be on display with the race bikes of local racing champion, Bob Crawford. Bob raced flat track and scrambles back in the '70s and was a Harley Davidson factory sponsored racer in the '80s. Bob opened St. Paul Harley Davidson and has a unique collection of racing memorabilia on display. The vintage race bikes of Minnesota flat track champion Bob Hoffmiester will also be there to give a picture of what racing was really like back in the day. The battle-scarred BSA motorcycles of AMA Hall of Fame member, Jeff Smith, will transport you to the brutal Motocross and Enduro trails of the '60s. Jeff Smith raced during the Golden Era of Motocross and held many world titles: two-time World Motocross champion, eight-time gold medal in the International Six Day Enduro, and winner of the first two Trans-AM races ever held in America. Also on display, be prepared to be amazed by the world record setting bikes of local inventor, stunt man and drag race king – Ky "the Rocketman" Michaelson. Ky's twin-engine BSA drag bike was a fixture of the Midwest drag scene in the '60s and his rocket-powered Harley jumped 26 busses back in '76!

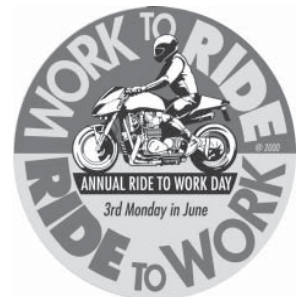
Bring Bikes!

Frozen Spushi?

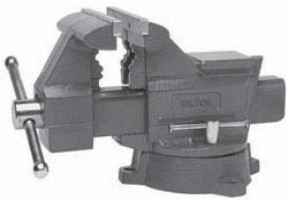
